Long-time West Springfield educator named 'Hometown Hero'

Ruth Willemain honored at annual breakfast

The American Red Cross of Western Massachusetts has named Ruth Willemain, founder of Harmony House of Western Massachusetts, a "Hometown Hero" for 2018. The "Hometown Hero" award celebrates the spirit of humanitarianism by honoring local people who have shown courage, kindness, and unselfish character through acts of heroism in Western Massachusetts. Ms. Willemain, along with six additional local recipients, was honored at the 16th Annual American Red Cross Hometown Heroes Breakfast on March 22 at the Sheraton Springfield. Over 500 community leaders, friends, and supporters of the honorees and the Red Cross attended. The breakfast helps to support local disaster relief.

Ruth, after 45 years of teaching, including several in West Springfield Public Schools, dedicated her energy to hospice care and spending time with nursing home residents. After visiting a private, non-profit home for the terminally ill in the mid-west, she recognized the need for a similar home in Western Massachusetts. Her dream of Harmony House was born. Ruth, along with many friends and volunteers, has spent years raising funds to implement the Harmony House mission of providing a loving home offering compassionate care for the terminally ill who have limited or no resources for special care in their final stages of life. Harmony House is a non-profit home, staffed by trained volunteers including licensed nurses, caregivers, companions, and others. Recently celebrating her 84th birthday, Ruth works

Harmony House is currently located on Pendleton Avenue in Chicopee, gratefully utilizing a home donated by a family who recognized the good work of

Harmony House. Since opening this home in 2017, there have been five residents who have spent their last days comforted by dedicated caregivers in a warm and loving atmosphere. The organization has purchased a property on View Street in Chicopee and is currently renovating that house with the hopes of being able to accept up to eight residents. The goal is to be open in 2019,

thus fulfilling Ruth's dream.
